- 3) National Round






To commemorate the 70th anniversary of independence of the country and 75th anniversary of Quit India Movement, the Central Board of Secondary Education proposed that schools should integrate activities on the theme of independence in curriculum transaction in the month of August. To extend our active participation in this endeavour, a **Pledge Taking Ceremony** was organised during the special assembly on 29th August 2017, wherein the students unanimously took a pledge to make India clean and free from problems like- poverty, corruption, terrorism, communalism and casteism. A painting competition was organised on the theme of Independence Movement on 30th August 2017 in which students of classes VI-X let loose their creative wings and painted the canvas with patriotism. A number of other events were also held across the school including Kite Making by the Primary students.

















A BBPS Technical Advisory Panel (TAP) has been created to look after all the Technology needs beyond academics- Creativity, Security, Productivity, Social, STEM and Misc. This is a group that will focus on embracing and adapting technology at minimal cost. The core group comprising of 11 members including the Principal and a parent will meet every month. The first meeting was held on 19th September, 2017. The agenda of the discussion was :

- Checking the possibility of procuring Virtual Reality softwares for students.
- Making capsule videos for different activities (lesson plans) for students.
- Merging website calendar with the google calendar.
- Sending notifications to the parents/teachers through the same.
- Checking the various applications under G suite.

The Core Group decided to select a group of Implementers (teachers, students and parents) who would carry forward and execute the decisions. Specific tasks were then discussed and assigned to task owners.



In order to enhance the learning experience of our students and to ignite their interest in computer programming, a Java Coder Course has been initiated for class VII students in the month of October. The course comprises of 9 instructional modules. A demo session of the course was conducted on 31st August, 2017 with one section of class VII. The students participated enthusiastically and the best performers were presented with souvenirs by the Java Coder Team.





No art program can be complete unless it provides some opportunity for three-dimensional activities, such as clay modelling and sculpture. It is one thing to draw or paint one's experiences on flat surface, but it is a far different experience to create threedimensionally. To work with new and different materials can itself be stimulating. The Primary **Department has introduced Sculpture in classes IV** & V and the students have been enjoying experimenting and creating with clay. The students of class V have also begun painting on canvas.








In order to develop innovative skills and inculcate interest for STEM education, our school has started **Technology Club** (Level I and II), for the Tech enthusiasts this year. Its aim is to teach students how to deal with all sorts of tools related to technology. In this club, they learn App development, coding and Robotics using Lego.

Students of Level I (classes 6 and 7) learnt the basics of gears, pulleys and levers. They developed a spinning top and power car using these parts. Lego EV3 kit was introduced. They constructed a basic bot. Students were introduced to programming and touch sensor of EV3.

Students of Level II (classes 8 and 9) were introduced to the microcontroller Arduino Uno kit. They started with basic Arduino programming and learned various interface. They developed the algorithm thinking skills in these sessions. They developed projects like a mood lamp using RGB, Object Avoidance Bot and Line follower Bot.







To help students attain proficiency in reading, the Middle Department has initiated a Reading Programme in classes VI to VIII. A whole range of new books catering to various genres has been procured for the Class Libraries giving the students ample opportunity to explore the world of books. All classrooms have a variety of books, allowing children to choose texts that match their reading ability. During the Reading Time, students read books to enhance their reading skills through carefully planned reading tasks that are age appropriate. Book Discussions and Book Reviews are some of the activities that are an integral part of this programme.

60 students from classes IX and X have registered for Times Spark, an initiative by Times of India. SPARK stands for Scholarship Programme for Awareness, Responsibility and **Knowledge**. As part of this programme, The Times of India will carry engaging articles across a range of fields like current affairs, science and technology, sports, politics, social issues, global development and many more. Over a span of three months, these articles will provide multi-dimensional perspectives to help students get a deeper understanding of various interesting subjects. At the end, there would be an online test followed by an interview to assess the students' understanding and perspectives. Students who excel at the test stand the chance to win an educational grant ranging from Rs. 1 Lakh to Rs. 2 Lakhs.







_'Cyber Safety Awareness' An initiative by Cyber Crime Branch, Delhi Police

The digital world is instant and everywhere. That is why it is important to be cybersmart. Understanding the consequences of online actions, knowing what to do if things go wrong and understanding online security can make the online experience of our children safer and more enjoyable.

The Cyber Crime Cell of Delhi Police organizes workshops on 'Cyber Safety Awareness' in schools across Delhi. The workshop aims to share and to familiarize the teachers about a standardized cyber safety awareness module that has been prepared by the Cyber Cell of Economic Offences Wing of Delhi Police. It has been observed that school going children are more vulnerable to cyber offences due to their inquisitiveness, curiosity and inadequate awareness about online threats and safe online habits.

Here are a few tips for parents presented by Cyber Crime Cell, Delhi Police to help them in sensitizing school going teenagers about cybercrime and how to be cyber smart.

 \gg Do not replace physical parental supervision of computer used at home with any safe search engine or any other tool. No search filtering software or tool is perfect.

 \gg Educate yourself also on social media safety and have open discussions with teens about present dangers and long term effects of inappropriate conduct, including posting pictures/videos online.

 \gg Keep the computer in an open area. Make a rule that doors are always left open when kids are online.

 \gg Advise your children to immediately exit any site that makes them feel uncomfortable or worried.

 \gg Parents should keep a track of persons with whom their children are talking to and which sites they are browsing. This is NOT invading their privacy at all, rather it is parenting in the digital space.

CYBER ALERT

Sarahah App: The new threat on the Cyber Horizon

Sarahah app's craze is continuing unabated. From teens to youngsters everyone seems to be hooked to it. The app is reportedly among the "Most Downloaded Apps" both on Apple's App Store and Google's Play Store. Though the app, which means 'honesty' in Arabic may have all the right intentions, however it surely is not being used with all honesty. Several users have reported of receiving harassing messages on the app.

This app is an anonymous app, meaning that you will not get to know who is sending you messages. One can send text messages to anyone, without revealing his or her identity. You cannot reply to the messages you receive on this app.

For those who do not wish to receive messages from a certain person, this app provides an option to block them. Once a contact is blocked, their message will also disappear from your account. But, it will not tell that person that he/she has been blocked. Also, this is an irreversible action.

The Sarahah App does not have an option to delete your account. If you go to Settings, it only gives you an option to Logout. The account can only be deleted from the app's website.

The curiosity to know who exactly is sending you a particular message, has led to a scam that is being circulated on this app. Many websites like **"www.sarahahexposed.com"** claim to reveal the sender's identity. However these websites are fake, aimed at making money.

There is no age verification in the app. Instead of giving constructive criticism, many teens are using the app for cyberbullying.

Parents have been warned against the app. It is being quoted as "The newest platform for cyber bullying".

It's time to wake up, Cyber Bullying is real!

WHAT IS BLUE WHALE?

- BLUE WHALE, started by Phillip Budeikin, is a game allegedly consisting of a series of tasks over a 50 day period, that recently created a panic wave in Russia and is now spreading all over the world.
- > The inventor claims that he started the game to "clean" the society by pushing to suicide those he deemed as having no value.
- > The challenge consists of tasks ranging from self- harm, watching horror movies to waking up at unusual hours, the last task being to kill oneself.
- > It targets young children and teenagers, who seek validation from others, even strangers, and is spreading via social media sites, such as Instagram.
- > It is yet unknown as to how the game is played online or any app is to be downloaded.
- It is now amidst us and is reaching out to vulnerable teens, who are online but not quite mature enough to process all the information out there.

CASE STUDY IN INDIA

Bal Bharati

A teenage boy comes across a link online, where he is given one challenge after the other. He accomplishes every task and keeps on moving to the subsequent levels. The final and concluding challenge asks him to commit suicide. He clicks himself on top of a building and jumps. The police claim that this is what led to the death of the 14-year-old Mumbai boy. This is the first death in India, which is being linked to the infamous **Blue Whale challenge**

Many children have been prey to the suicide game.

It is also the cause behind the death of 150 tecnagers in Russia, in 2013.

PRECAUTIONS

- ✓ Parents should inculcate self-esteem and the confidence to say "no" in their children.
- ✓ Experts advise parents to help in strengthening the children mentally and to educate them against suicide.
- ✓ Children should be confident that they will be accepted even if they don't follow the crowd.
- ✓ Children should be taught to never blindly trust any stranger they meet online.

This initiative has resulted in stronger classroom bonding and boosted the confidence of each student, making them feel special and important.





A Daily Reading Period, an initiative begun in the month of July, is being followed diligently in the Primary classes. The same story book is distributed to all and the class reads it together. A class discussion follows. All the classes have read 8 books till date from July. This initiative has been greatly appreciated by the parent fraternity.

The primary classes follow a strict tradition of '1 Minute Per Period- Cleanliness'. The first minute of the period is devoted to cleaning the class. This has become a habit with the students and the teachers has greatly helped the classes and the surrounding areas look very clean even at the end of the day. Observing No Trash Day on a regular basis is part of the schedule.

It was a Science Extravaganza designed to hone up the scientific skills of young learners by providing them ample opportunities with 'Hands-on Activities'. The whole stadium was divided into small compartments where experiments on sound, electricity, pressure, robotics were showcased.









'Living Art', an interesting competition, was held in the Primary Department wherein students were encouraged to be innovative and grow a plant in any vessel/container or any other novel object. They were given a month to grow the plant. The response was overwhelming. The creativity of the students could be seen in the innovative planters that were used to grow the plants. Students used a discarded football, shoe, a pocket or a pair of shorts and even an old toy truck.









Art is one of those things we simply must do so that our spirits may grow. With this aim, the Primary Department organised an 'Art Festival' for the students of classes III, IV and V on Wednesday, 11th October 2017. The theme was "I dream my painting and then I paint my dream." The students were given complete freedom to choose and paint their dream fantasy choosing any colour medium. The students participated enthusiastically in the event, drawing and colouring the world of their dreams sitting in the basketball court of the school.















The students and teachers of the Primary Department have been assigned a special task this Diwali. Each child has pledged to celebrate a cracker free Diwali and instead light the lives of 4 less privileged people on the day by sharing a meal with them. They will click a picture of this which will be put up on the 'Lighting Lives Wall'.







Janmashtami was celebrated in the Pre-primary Department. The stage was decorated with lord Krishna jhula and tableaus depicting incidents of his life. Children of class I dressed up as Krishna, Radha and Gopiyan presented beautiful dance performances. A puja was performed by teachers and students along with bhajans and aarti. Fragrance of flowers, soothing aroma of burning camphor and jingle of hymns filled the atmosphere with divinity. They also pasted pictures of lord Krishna in a worksheet in their classes. Children of class II also prsented short skit, in which they enacted short incidents from lord Krishna's Life.











Children from Pre-primary Department visited an NGO Sarthak Prayas on 5th August, 2017 and distributed biscuits and Frooti as a token of love towards them. The NGO organized a few fun filled activities for the students which they really enjoyed.

Students' safety and security is our top priority at all times. In the wake of the recent unfortunate events, it has become imperative that we affirm and strengthen the trust of our parents by reassuring them that the students are extremely secure in our school at all times.

Various security and screening methods have been in place for many years. They are regularly used to ascertain protection of life and property. Competent staff, vigilant support staff and trained security officers monitor and ensure safety and security in each area of the school. All these measures ascertain that Bal Bharati, Pitampura, stays a 'Safe School'.

•We have recently added around 48 cameras. At present we have 301 cameras installed and each corner of the school is kept under constant surveillance at all times. •Metal detectors are now being used to screen all visitors and staff at the main entry and exit points. •Two former army men have been appointed as Vigilance Officers in the

appointed as Vigilance Officers in the school.

•We have recently appointed lady guards to accompany all school and private buses in the morning as well as afternoon. All the school buses are equipped with CCTV cameras and GPS tracking systems to facilitate increased awareness about the students' well-being and whereabouts.

- A newsletter updating parents about all existing safety measures at school has specially been designed for parents to assure them that their kids are safe while they are in the school.
- All staff members, including the teaching staff, have been instructed to obtain and submit a Character Verification Certificate and a Police Clearance Certificate immediately.

•Comprehensive circulars relating to the new safety norms are sent to the parents to keep them informed of the new developments taking place.

•The children are guided to move out of the class with a friend. It is mandatory for the students to wear a Teacher's Pass before moving out at all times. They have also been advised to write their names on the board as they move out so that the teachers can keep a track of them.

•The students have been advised not to carry any hazardous or pointed objects like scissors, lead pencils etc. to school. Surprise bag checks are carried out regularly.

•Parents have been advised not to drop their kids at school before 7:10 am (Senior Time) and 8:10 am (Primary and Montessori Time).

•A concern of the van drivers' reliability and authenticity has been raised by the school. Parents have been requested to submit necessary documents after a thorough background check of the drivers has been carried out by them. The school has volunteered to take the onus of the smooth and safe dispersal of the van students by allocating van leaders, putting teachers on duty and ensuring that the dispersal takes place in an orderly manner. It is now mandatory that one parent accompanies the children in the van at all times.

•The entry to the Pre-Primary Department has been restricted to female staff and female visitors only.

•Student Safety Squad, a body of selected senior students, has been appointed. The squad promotes safety amongst the students. They are alert and keep a watchful eye in and around the school and report any anomaly immediately to the school authorities. They use activities, games and presentations to educate students across all classes about safety issues.
