- There were several changes in economic a political life between 600 BCE and 600 CE. Some of these changes influenced societies as well.
- The extension of agriculture into forested areas transformed the lives of forest dwellers; craft specialists often emerged as distinct social groups; the unequal distribution of wealth sharpened social differences.
- Historians often use textual traditions to understand these processes.
- Some texts lay down norms of social behaviour; others describe and occasionally comment on a wide range of social situations and practices.
- In focusing on the Mahabharata, a colossal epic running in its present form into over 100,000 verses with depictions of a wide range of social categories and situations, we draw on one of the richest texts of the subcontinent.
