

READING NUMERALS


In this lesson, let's study about **how to read the numerals STEPS TO BE FOLLOWED**

- Mark periods using commas.
- Start putting commas from R.H.S(right hand side)
- Put first comma after 3 places of ONES PERIOD (ones, tens, hundreds)
- Next comma is put after 2 places of THOUSANDS PERIOD (thousand, ten thousand)
- Next is after 2 places of LAKHS PERIOD (lakh, ten lakh)

EXAMPLE 1 4 15 29 682



Four crore, fifteen lakh, twenty nine thousand, six hundred eighty two.






