## LET'S REVISE

A <mark>singular</mark> noun is <mark>one</mark> person, place, thing, or idea.

Example: one boy. A <mark>plural</mark> noun is <mark>more than one</mark> person, place, thing, or idea. Example: many boys

Singular	Plural
a/one banana	two banana <mark>s</mark>
an/one egg	two egg <mark>s</mark>
an/one apple	a kilo of apple <mark>s</mark>
a/one baby	two bab <mark>ies</mark>
a/one dress	three dress <mark>es</mark>

#### PLURAL NOUN = SINGULAR NOUN + 's' (usually)

#### **Remember!**

Nouns that <b>end in</b>	Suffix to be added	Plural
<b>s, ss, sh, ch, x</b> (Eg: bus, dish, watch, box, potat <i>o</i> , tomat <i>o,</i> <i>volcano, hero)</i>	+ -es	bus <b>es</b> , class <b>es</b> , dish <b>es</b> , watch <b>es</b> , box <b>es</b> , potato <b>es</b> , tomato <b>es</b> , volcanoes her <b>oes</b>
<u>consonant</u> + y (family, baby, country)	change <b>y to i</b> + – <b>es</b>	famil <b>ies</b> , bab <b>ies</b> , countr <b>ies</b> , cit <b>ies</b>

**f, fe** (wife, wolf, knife)

wi**ves**, wol**ves**, kni**ves** 

**vowel + y** (boy, toy)

+ s

boys, toys

IRREGULAR NOUNS (These nouns become plural by changing their spellings in ways other than the usual rules given above.)

- man men
- woman women
- child children
- tooth teeth
- foot feet
- person people
- sheep sheep
- fish fish
- mouse mice
- goose geese
- louse lice
- ox oxen
- deer deer

These nouns are **not the only** irregular nouns, but they are probably the most **common** irregular ones.

#### NOUNS THAT ARE ALWAYS PLURAL

- clothes
- jeans
- shorts
- glasses / spectacles (formal)
- sunglasses
- scissors
- trousers (British English) / pants (American English)
- thanks
- news

We can say:

A pair of jeans / shorts / trousers (pants) / scissors
