#### Dear Children

Before that...REMEMBER! There are some nouns that are always Plural.

## For example:

- jeans
- shorts
- glasses / spectacles (formal)
- sunglasses
- scissors
- trousers (British English) / pants (American English)
- News

#### We can also say:

A pair of jeans / shorts / trousers (pants) / scissors

(Note: By adding phrases like a pair of... these nouns become Singular. Otherwise, they remain plural.)
