
CHAPTER-2 SECTORS OF THE INDIAN ECONOMY

INTRODUCTION

In this E-lesson we will study about the ways to overcome the problem of disguised unemployment from the primary sector of the Indian economy.

The various ways could be:

- 1. **Imparting education-** to make them capable of working in the secondary and tertiary sectors. Also, to break their orthodox beliefs that don't let them leave the primary sector
- 2. Inculcating skills and imparting training to help them pick up different occupations
- 3. Encouraging entrepreneurship and self-employment by arranging for cheap, easy and flexible credit
- 4. **Improvement in the transportation facilities** to encourage the mobility of the workforce from rural to urban areas
- 5. Giving employment under various government schemes like NREGA



6. **Promoting industrial growth** to absorb the migrants from primary to secondary sector

RISING IMPORTANCE OF THE TERTIARY SECTOR

Over the last 40-50 years, it has been observed that the tertiary sector has emerged as the largest producing sector replacing the primary and secondary sectors.

The reasons for the rising importance of the tertiary sector are:

- 1. Rise in the demand for basic services like healthcare, education, postal services, sanitation etc.
- 2. The development of the primary and secondary sector has led to an automatic growth of the tertiary sector.
- 3. Increased demand for luxuries, recreation and rejuvenating activities like spa, shopping mall, restaurants, travel and tourism.
- 4. Due to globalization, the demand for transportation, communication and satellite technology has gone up rapidly.

<u>NOTE</u>: Please note that the services have not grown equally well. At one end, the demand for educated and skilled workers like doctors, architects, lawyers etc. has gone up while on the other hand people who work like rickshaw pullers, garbage pickers, repair workers etc. still continue to struggle for a decent living.
