





Answer 6) Our rich diversity has been of immense importance to us:

Answer 7)

- Prejudice means to judge other people negatively or see them as inferior.
- Stereotype means to fix people into one image.

Stereotype and prejudice are negative attitude towards differences.

• Discrimination is incorrect behaviour because of this negative attitude(prejudice and stereotype).

Hence, prejudice and stereotype result in discrimination, which makes us ignore and disrespect differences around.

- Did not give equal respect to all castes in the society.
