


What makes a good poster?

- Important information should be readable from about 5 feet away
- Title is short and draws interest
- Word count of about 80 to 100 words
- Text is clear and to the point
- Use of bullets, numbering and headlines make it easy to read
- Effective use of graphics, colour and fonts
- Consistent and clean layout, is clutter free
- Includes name of the issuing person/ authority
