In our day to day life, we come across many situations where we have to use mathematical operations to solve them. Let us take some examples .

Example 1. A florist needs 4600 Marigold flowers, 2900 Roses, 1960 Lilies to decorate a hall. How many flowers does he need in all?

Solution :

Number of Marigold flowers needed = 4600
 Number of Rose flowers needed = 2900
 Number of Lilies needed = 1960
 Total number of flowers needed = 4600+2900+1960

Thus florist needs 9460 flowers to decorate the hall.

Example 2: 3900 cars can be parked in a parking area. On a particular day, 1995 cars were parked. How many more cars can be parked on that day?

Solution :

Total number of cars that can be parked = 3900
 Number of cars already parked = 1995
 Number of cars that can still be parked = 3900- 1995

Thus 1905 more cars could be parked in the parking area on that day.

Steps to follow to solve a statement question :

- Read the question carefully.
- Identify what we are looking for?(Total number of flowers/Number of more cars that can be parked)
- Decide the operation to be used to solve the question.(key words also help us to decide the operation)
- Frame the statements according to the question.
- Solve the question by applying the required operation and get the answer.
- Do not forget to write the Answer statement at the end.

Q1) A dealer purchased a second hand car for ₹3,65,000 and spent ₹3,600 for maintenance. How much money did he spend in all?

Q2) In a library, there are 29,189 books of English, 970 books of French and 3,646 books of Mathematics. How many books are there altogether?

Q3) A grain merchant bought 90,395 kg of wheat and sold 79,286 kg of wheat. How much wheat is left with him?

Q4) Rahul had ₹ 2,40,00 in his bank account. He withdrew ₹ 48,563 from his account. How much money is left in his account?
