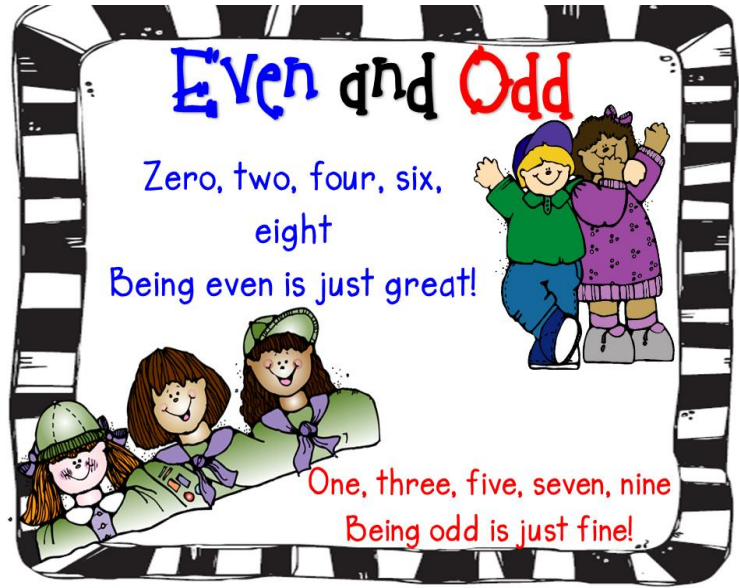
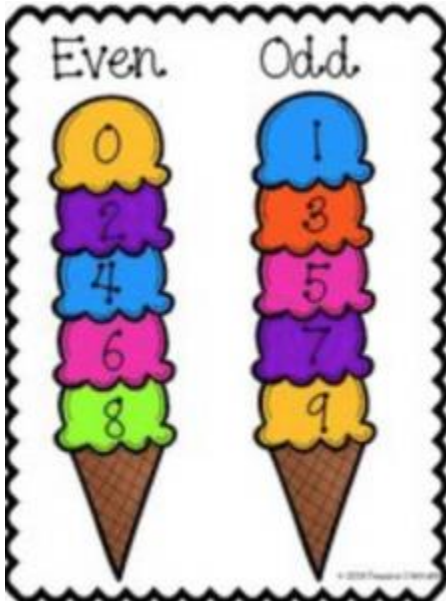

Eg:- () = 3

() () = 5

1, 3, 5, 7, 9
