

- Many rivers start from these glaciers:



The kangri is an earthen pot filled with burning charcoal and kept in a handmade basket. It is carried as a personal warmer. It is decorated with colourful threads, mirror-work and sequins. It is used by people of Kashmir. It keeps them warm during the winter months when temperature dips to as low as -20°C.

It is a portable and moving heater that Kashmiris keep in their pheran(a long woolen cloak reaching down to the knees) worn by people during the frosty winters. The kangri is eco-friendly, effective and a cheap heating arrangement in the modern times when electronic heating gadgets are available. It is cheaper than oil, gas and wood-fired heaters and costs approximately ₹ 70/-. In the absence of electricity or load-shedding, it does not disappoint people and keeps them warm in harsh winters.
