 Rules to form a sentence in the Simple Past Tense: For regular verbs, add -ed to the root form of the verb (or just -d if the root form already ends in an e): 				
Eg play→played	type-	→ typed	dance→ danc	ed push→pushed
 For irregular verbs, things get more complicated. The simple past tense of some irregular verbs looks exactly like the root form: 				
Eg put→put	cut→cut	set→set	cost→cost	hit→hit
 For other irregular verbs, including the verb to be, the simple past forms are more erratic: 				

go→went

has/have→had

do→did

→rose

Eg.- see→saw

am/is/are→was/were

build→built
