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

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#### **NEW INITIATIVES:**

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
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

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
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
## **Online Reading Period -**

#### **HIGHLIGHTS:**

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

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


 Under the program of Art Integrated Learning, class 3 students tested their CULINARY SKILLS by making a Nutritious Salad using food items from the three major categories of food. 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
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- ❖ An Online Story Fest was organized by the Primary Department in collaboration with Scholastic India from 17th August to 21st August 2020, wherein the students got a oneof-a-kind virtual experience to listen to some interesting stories narrated by renowned story-tellers such as Ms. Rohini Choudhary and Mr. Vikram Sridhar for 5 consecutive days.
- News Reporting is not only a creative way of learning the language, but also a very challenging task. The students of Class V were provided with the unique chance of participating in a News Reading Activity as part of their Science Project. This activity was designed as part of the lesson dealing with the harmful effects of soil erosion which leads to landslides in the hillsides and flooding of the plains due to the overflowing of large rivers. Some parts of our country are facing the brunt of this natural calamity as a consequence of large-scale deforestation and destruction of environment. The students were asked to study the flood situation in the states of Bihar, Assam and West Bengal and present a report on the same in the class. It was a great learning experience for all involved.

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On the occasion of India's 74th Independence Day, the students of class III took part in the Online Competition 'Warriors of Liberty - A Monodrama'. Keeping up the spirit of patriotism, the participants dressed up as famous freedom fighters and other personalities such as Bhagat Singh, Rani Jhansi and Mangal Pandey. The participants gave stupendous performances and were well applauded and appreciated by all who watched their performance.



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
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

The SubTopic of Flora and Fauna of Sikkim along with Rare and Endangered species was taken up for the same. The students enjoyed researching and exploring the rich biodiversity of Sikkim w.r.t. its flora and fauna. They presented their findings as PPTs explaining the special and unique identification features of the various birds, butterflies, animals and flowers found there. They also delved into finding the reasons behind the plants and animals endangered or gone extinct.

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
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The topic of 'Symmetry' in Mathematics was introduced in Class V by showing YouTube links on symmetry in nature and man-made objects. Students were also shown rangoli patterns. The symmetrical Kolum Rangoli patterns and asymmetrical Alpana art patterns were shown through screen sharing in order to show the difference between symmetrical and asymmetrical objects in the surroundings. The topic was extended further by taking the students for a virtual tour of Taj Mahal, thereby creating awareness about the symmetry in beautiful monuments and its importance in architecture. The students were also asked to draw any monument of their choice, wherein students drew beautiful monuments such as Eiffel Tower, Statue of Liberty and Lotus Temple.





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The students of Class IV participated in a Collage Making activity as part of the lesson 'The Northern and Coastal Plains' in Social Science. For this activity, the students were guided to search any two states mentioned in the lesson of and find out the details with regard to the cultural diversity there. They presented the same by making a collage. The students also spoke a few lines explaining their collage. This activity helped the students understand the cultural diversity amongst the states covered by the plains in India.



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
With an aim to make English lessons more interesting and interactive, the students of Class III participated in 'Painting a Pot' activity as part of the lesson 'Magic Vessels'. The students were made acquainted with **Pottery** which is the process of forming vessels and other objects with clay and other ceramic materials at high temperatures to give them a hard, durable form. Major types include earthenware, stoneware and porcelain. During the activity, the students had to create their own magical vessels by painting a vessels/earthen pots/diya with their favourite colours and then decorate them with whatever material was available at home. The students were highly enthusiastic about the activity. They applied their creativity and made wonderful vessels. The vessels were then used to store a number of things, plant a sapling etc.



- ❖ **Reading Week** was organized in the Primary Department from 08<sup>th</sup> September 2020 to 14th September 2020. A plethora of activities were organized for the students every day to inculcate and nurture the habit of reading among students. The activities included a number of events such as
