
IN FOND REMEMBERANCE

PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

Highlights: November, 2019 to March, 2020

Report: 1st April, 2020 to 27th July, 2020

The school, having been unable to share the report of activities from November, 2019 to March, 2020, presents the highlights of this period.

Our school was ranked 12th in India and 3rd in New Delhi in the category 'INDIA'S TOP 20 CBSE SCHOOLS' by EDUCATION TODAY.

Our school was declared a FIT India School and was issued a Certificate of Recognition by the Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports, Government of India.

We received the Brainfeed School Excellence Award 2020 in the category Best CBSE School for Sports Education, Parental Education and Inspirational Leadership.

We secured the First Position as a Goodwill Ambassador in the city for Swacch Bharat Mission by North Delhi Municipal Corporation.



The school received the FICCI Special Jury Award at FICCI Road Safety Award Ceremony 2019 in the category 'Excellence in Road Safety Initiative by Schools' for the project 'Share the Roads'.

The school received the Pursuit of Mathematics Excellence Award by Clash of Pi (Global Mathematics Circuit). 900 schools across India participated.



The Interact Club of our school won the Governor's Recognition Award 'Elite Club' for its outstanding contribution in the furtherance of the cause of Rotary during the Rotary year 2019-20. Ms. Rashmi Ashtikar, received the District Governor's Special Appreciation Certificate as the Teacher Advisor of the club.

10 students of class XII and 16 from class X received the Certificate of Merit for being in top 0.1% from CBSE for the session 2018-19.

Overcoming all challenges, our students strode ahead during this period achieving laurels and making the school proud.








STAFF A CHIEVEMENTS

- Ms Amandeep Kaur, TGT Science, and Ms Neetika Babbar, TGT Maths, were adjudged 'Budding Thought Provoker'.







Undeterred by the pandemic, the school took on unprecedented challenges using various online tools to ensure that the teaching learning process continued unhampered. - Students of the Middle Department have been provided access for online learning portals such as Khan Academy, Funtoot and Mindspark. Regular assignments from such portals give the students an indepth understanding and application of mathematical concepts.




VIRTUAL LABS



These tours were followed by discussions and group activities based on the same.





- Weekly Tests for classes III to V have commenced on 25th July, 2020.


REMEDIAL CLASSES







- Another dish phagshapa which is Nepalese in origin is eaten is Sikkim.







- Library Activities are planned for students and links of apps that offer a plethora of audio books and e-books are being shared with them in order to foster the reading habit.



ENGLISH LANGUAGE PROGRAMME





SAFETY AND SECURITY
