## CHRISTMAS CAKE



## Ingredients

## $1 / 4$ cup caramel sauce

$1 / 4$ cup vegetable oil
$1 / 4$ tin (85 g) sweetened condensed milk
$1 / 2$ tsp vanilla extract
1 tbsp rum (optional)
Zest of one orange
100 g all-purpose flour/ Maida
$11 / 2$ tbsp cocoa powder
1/2 tsp baking powder
1/2 tsp baking soda
1/4 cup chopped bananas
2 tbsp salted roasted almonds
2 tbsp chopped hazelnuts
1/4 cup chopped Oreo cookies
4 orange segments

- 3 tbsp dark chocolate chunks
- 3 tbsp Water (or as required)


## Method -

1) Combine caramel sauce, vegetable oil, condensed milk, vanilla extract, rum(optional), orange zest, orange segments, chopped bananas and dry fruits.
2) Sift maida, cocoa powder, baking powder, baking soda into the above mixture.
3) Bake in a preheated oven at 170 degrees for $35-45$ minutes or till done.
