Simple future tense

The **simple future** is a verb **tense** that's used to talk about things that haven't happened yet. It is used when an action is promised/thought to occur in the **future**.

Example: We shall move to another city.

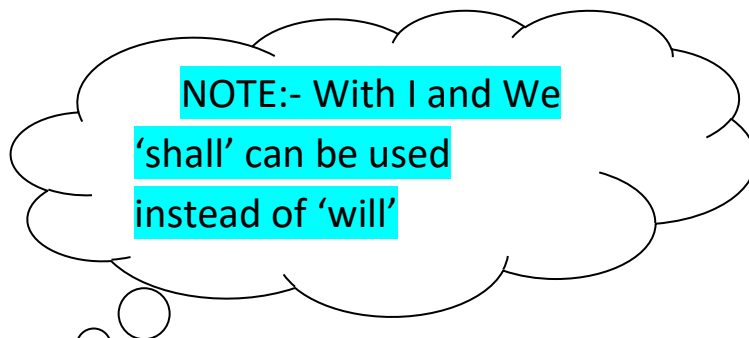
He will come to New York tomorrow.

SIMPLE FUTURE TENSE - WILL + VERB (PRESENT TENSE)

USAGE	EXAMPLE
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • To denote an action which is yet to happen. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • I <u>shall go</u> to the market. • My mother <u>will go</u> to the post office.
<p>Value : One should plan for his future in advance and strive hard to achieve it.</p>
