Dear students,

In the last e-lesson, we learnt that Mahatma Gandhi returned to India from South Africa in 1915. His method of fighting, known as **Satyagrah**, was based on two principles- truth and non-violence.

In this module, let us learn about the movements started by the Indians against the British and their impact on our country. Let us study about them one by one:-

JALLIANWALA BAGH MASSACRE- [13th APRIL, 1919]

- A public meeting was held at Jallianwala Bagh in Amritsar on 13th April, 1919.
- General Dyer came there and ordered his soldiers to fire at the crowd.
- Hundreds of innocent and unarmed men, women and children were killed and thousands were injured.
- The country was shocked by this incident as it showed the true face of the British rule.



NON-COOPERATION MOVEMENT- [1920]

- Gandhiji started this movement to protest against the Jallianwala Bagh masssacre.
- People were asked to disobey the laws peacefully.

REASONS TO WITHDRAW THIS MOVEMENT- Some angry Indians set fire to a police station in Chauri Chaura (Uttar Pradesh) and 22 policemen died. Gandhiji was against non-violence and withdrew this movement.



SIMON COMMISSION- [1928]

• It was appointed to improve the law and order situation in the country.

REASON TO BOYCOTT- As there were no Indian members in it, the Congress decided to boycott it.
