


4 Class IV – Animals – How Life Goes On – Structure of an Egg:

To help children gain interest and appreciate the need and importance of the process of reproduction in living things while also understanding reproduction in oviparous animals, the children were asked to create the structure of a hen's egg through clay modelling. The children very innovatively explored alternate materials too like dough, turmeric powder or even the all-purpose flour to create a well labelled structure of an egg. The activity which was thoroughly enjoyed by all children not only helped them recall the role and importance of the different parts of an egg but also trace the developmental stages of the embryo in the life cycle of a bird.



1. SPECIAL INITIATIVES:-

* WOW - Word of the Week:-




2. IDS (International Dimension in Schools) - Earlier ISA:-

* World Environment Day:-
