## To Be or Not to Be Shakespeare

Fair is foul, and foul is fair: Hover through the fog and filthy air." The owner of these words was an English playwright, poet, and actor, widely regarded as the greatest writer in the English language, but there's no hard evidence that Will Shakespeare of Stratford-upon-Avon (1564-1616) could even write a complete sentence. Shakespeare the writer was one of the most broadly educated authors in English literature but there are controversies, Henry James wrote to a friend in 1903 that he was "haunted by the conviction that the divine William is the biggest and most successful fraud ever practised on a patient world." Other doubters have also been famous personalities, Mark Twain, Walt Whitman and Sigmund Freud. On the contrary have been believers who advocate that "If being Shakespeare were a crime, you wouldn't have enough to convict Will of Stratford." The life of the legend hence remains a mystery.

We speak English but do we know where it comes from? By dwelling deep I found that the language took birth a little after A.D. 600. Wanderers in the northern Europe forests used it, belonging to an Indo-European Family. The dialect, via blessed messengers (Anglo-Saxons) spread on the coast of Europe during the Roman Realm. Latin played an influential role here. A few of the words taken from Latin are; pot, wine, cheese, butter, cheap. When Anglo-Saxons got to be Christian in 597, they learned Latin. Agreeing to the impacts of English, the history of the dialect separated into three; Ancient English (7th century-1100), Centre English (1100-1450/1500), Present day English (1500-now). In a few books Cutting edge English is partitioned in to two Early advanced (1500-1700), Late Cutting edge (1700-now).

Despite running to over 1,000 pages, The Faerie Queene was left unfinished. Edmund Spenser died suddenly in 1599, and left his great work only partially completed.

With over 350 million native speakers worldwide, English is the third-most commonly spoken language worldwide. British English is more lenient with the letter "R" than American English; it's only pronounced if it's followed by a vowel. It also differentiates itself from American English in terms of spelling.

The dialect of Ireland is known for its old-timey charm, and often appears in pop culture. To sound like the Irish, start by turning your "Ds" into "Js" when they come at the beginning of a word – so "duty" is pronounced like "juty". And non-native speakers will be glad to know that the Irish often forgo the "TH" sound altogether, instead replacing it with more easily pronounced alternatives like "T" or "D".

G'day, mate! The Australian dialect, spoken by over 20 million Aussies, is instantly recognisable, in part thanks to internationally famous Australian celebrities such as the late Steve Erwin, who popularised it across the globe. Indian English also uses the original Indian counting system for large numbers, employing words like "lakh", which refers to 100,000. Although this might seem peculiar to those unfamiliar with the system


Mary Ann Evans authored all of her novels under the alias George Eliot, believing that a man would be more well-received.


