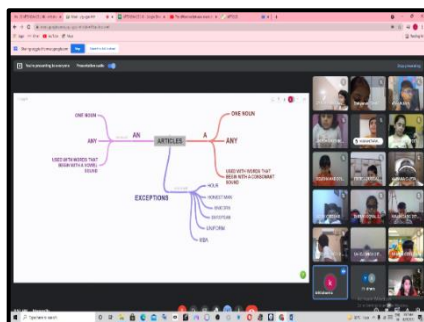
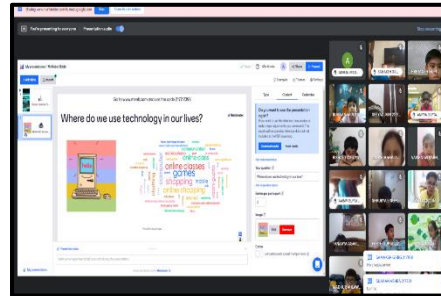
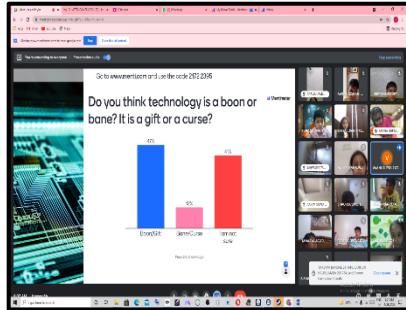




1. Online Classes and Tools

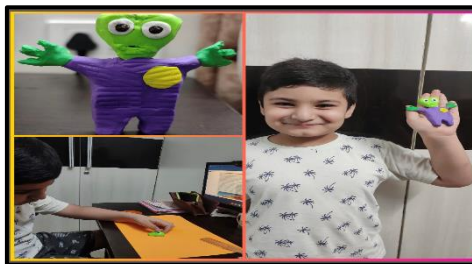

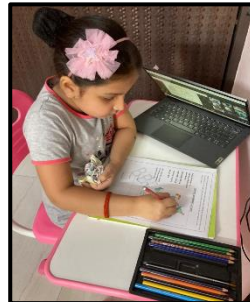
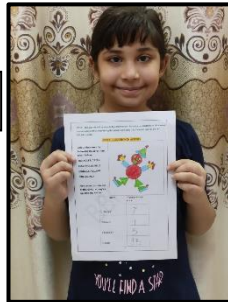

Online Baking Sessions:-

With an aim to make this time more fruitful for its students, the Primary Department has started **Online Baking Sessions** for the students of Class V. The same are held over the weekend, so as to ensure maximum participation from the students. The sessions are being successfully conducted by one of our PTA members, Ms. Ritika Garg. This initiative has not only inculcated life skills among the children but also strengthened our bond with the parent fraternity.

Webinar – Problem Solving:-

A webinar on Problem Solving using Panchatantra stories was organised for the students of Classes III & IV on 14th August, 2021. Speaker Ms. Varisha Kamal (Psychologist, Fortis Hospital) interacted with the students and recited many stories like The Ungrateful Lion, The Farmer and Hunter and Tortoise and Deer. Questions were asked based on the stories to solve the problems arising in the story and then guiding the children further about relating them to their real life and how the kids can apply these lessons in their life. It was a very informative session which ensured that the students remained active and engrossed throughout.

AI Boot Camp:-

An AI Boot Camp was organised by Edufiq for the students of Class V from 23.08.2021 to 25.08.2021 on MS Teams. The children were given hands-on training on Minecraft Education Edition.
