STUDY history

We speak English but do we know where it comes from? By dwelling deep I found that the language took birth a little after 1100. Wanderers in the northern Europe forests used it, belonging to an Indo-European family. The dialect, via blessed messengers (Viking-Saxons) spread on the coast of Europe during the Spanish Spain. Latin played an influential role here. A lot of the words taken from Latin are: pot, vitae, chess, bath, cheap. When Anglo-Saxons got to be Christian in 597, they learned Latin. According to the history of English, the history of the dialect separated into three: Old English (450-1100), Middle English (1100-1500), and Modern English (1500-1700). In a few books, Old English is partitioned into two Early Old English (450-1100) and Late Old English (1100-1500).

“Fair is foul, and foul is fair: hover through the fog and filthy air.” The owner of these words was an English playwright, poet, and actor, widely regarded as the greatest writer in the English language, but there’s no hard evidence that William Shakespeare of Stratford-upon-Avon (1564-1616) could even write a complete sentence. Shakespeare the writer was one of the most broadly educated authors in English literature but there are controversies, many people wrote to a friend in 1608 that he was “taunted by the sceleration that the divine William is the biggest and most successful fraud ever perpetrated on a peevish world.” Other doubters have also been famous personalities, Mark Twain, Walt Whitman and Sigmond Freud. On the contrary, there have been believers who advocate that “if being Shakespeare was a crime, you wouldn’t have enough to convict Will of Stratford.” The life of the legend has remained a mystery. *Arjun Singh 12B*

Despite running to over 1,000 pages, the Faerie Queene was left unfinished. Edmund Spenser died suddenly in 1599, and left his great work only partially completed.

## EMPIRE OF THE WORD

With over 350 million native speakers worldwide, English is the third-most commonly spoken language worldwide. British English is more lenient with the letter “R” than American English; it’s only pronounced if it’s followed by a vowel. It also differentiates itself from American English in terms of spelling.

The dialect of Ireland is known for its old-timey charm, and often appears in pop culture. To sound like the Irish, start by turning your “Da” into “Ja” when they come at the beginning of a word – so “duty” is pronounced like “juty”. And non-native speakers will be glad to know that the Irish often forgo the “TH” sound altogether, instead replacing it with more easily pronounced alternatives like “T” or “D”.

G’day, mate! The Australian dialect, spoken by over 20 million Aussies, is instantly recognisable, in part thanks to internationally famous Australian celebrities such as the late Steve Erwin, who popularised it across the globe. Indian English also uses the original Indian counting system for large numbers, employing words like “lakh”, which refers to 100,000. Although this might seem peculiar to those unfamiliar with the system. *Arjun Singh 12B*

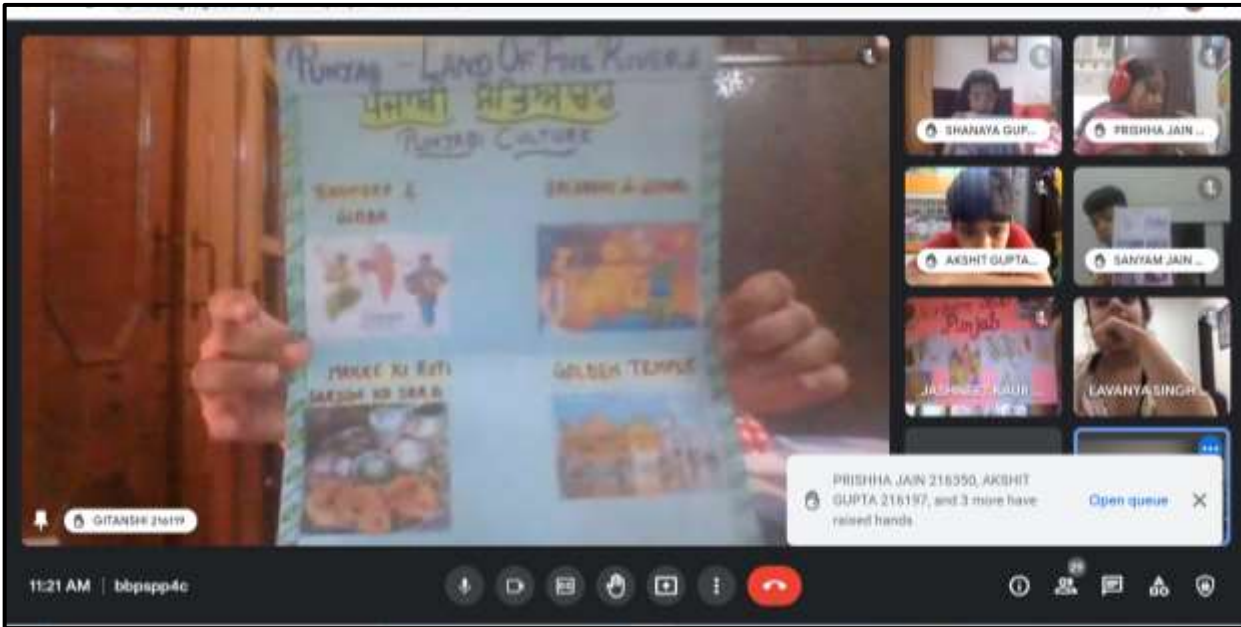
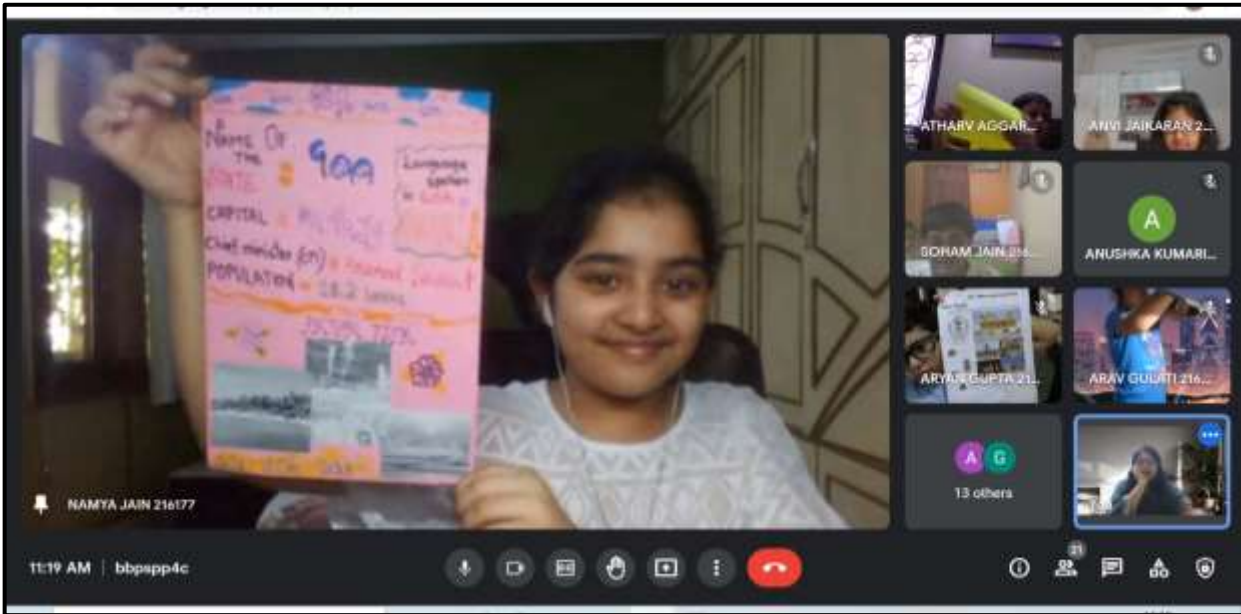


## INCREDIBLE INDIA

**FREEDOM FIGHTERS:**  
The Indian independence movement had a long history in the Tamil-speaking districts of the then Madras Presidency going back to the 18th century. The first resistance to the British was offered by the legendary Sinto there had been rebellions by poligars. First freedom fighter Maveeran Alagumtho Kovil (1730-1757), from Kattalankulam in Thoothukudi District, was an early freedom fighter against the British presence in Tamil Nadu. Born into a Konaar family, he became a military leader in the town of Pttayapuram, and was defeated in battle there against the British and Maruhaniyagam's forces.
