General Guidelines for the Holiday Homework Project

1. Students are required to create a **Flipbook** for the Holiday Homework. (How to create a Flipbook - <https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=6NUAMSHQtCc>)
2. Make a proper index of the content page and picture gallery along with the serial number.
3. The project can be handwritten/a PDF/a PPT – which must be converted into a **digital Flipbook**.
4. **Cover page** should be made aesthetically.
 - Should be creative indicating the name of the student along with the class, section, and session (2022-23).
5. All the pictures downloaded from the internet, must indicate the address of the website.
 - You may make a collage of photographs to demonstrate a particular point.
 - You may use newspaper clippings.
5. **Bibliography**- indicating address of the website, books, journals etc. referred to.
7. Attach these pages at the end of the file before the last page.
8. The last page must be a **Certificate Page** certifying that the entire work has been done by the child himself /herself.

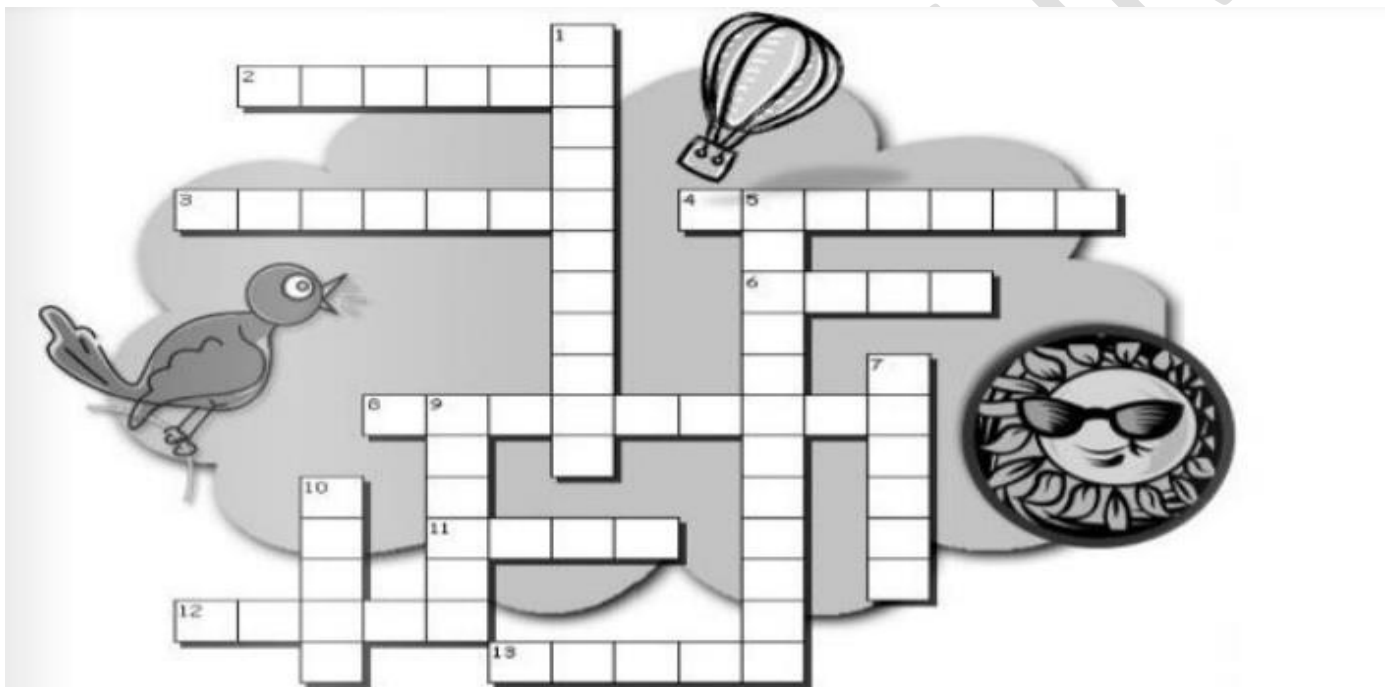

MATHEMATICS

An identity is an equality which is true for every value of the variable, but an equation is true for only some of the values of the variables.

Some algebraic identities you have studied in previous class are:

- $(x + y)^2 = x^2 + 2xy + y^2$

Example

Solve $(S + 7)^2$ by using suitable identities

Solution : $(S + 7)^2 = (S + 7)(S + 7)$; by the algebraic identity $(x + y)^2 = x^2 + y^2 + 2xy$

$$= S^2 + 7^2 + 2 \times S \times (7) = S^2 + 49 + 14S$$

- $(x - y)^2 = x^2 - 2xy + y^2$

Solve $(t - \frac{2}{3})^2$ by using suitable identities

Solution : $(t - \frac{2}{3})^2 = (t - \frac{2}{3})(t - \frac{2}{3})$; by the algebraic identity $(x - y)^2 = x^2 - 2xy + y^2$

$$= t^2 - 2 \times t \times (\frac{2}{3}) + (\frac{2}{3})^2 = t^2 - \frac{4}{3}t + \frac{4}{9}$$

- $x^2 - y^2 = (x + y)(x - y)$

Solve $9x^2 - 16y^2$ by using suitable identities

Solution : $9x^2 - 16y^2 = (3x)^2 - (4y)^2 = (3x - 4y)(3x + 4y)$
