### How to change the "Undo Send" setting in Gmail

Imagine a scenario:- An email meant to be sent to someone goes to someone else it wasn't meant for!! Wish you could undo the sending !!

Don't panic, as this scenario is unlikely to occur if you adjust the Undo Send setting in Gmail before you send out the email.

1. Open your rGMAIL account and click on settings (the gear icon)
2. Click on See all Settings option.
3. Ensure that general tab is open and is in blue colour.
4. Focus on the Undo Send Button and change the Send cancellation period.
5. Change cancellation period as per your choice. The maximum time period is 30 seconds. Scroll down the page and click on Save Changes option.
6. If you have an additional email address, send an email to the address from which you are writing your message. After clicking the send button on your email, a message box will pop up in the lower left corner with the Undo option, select it and your email is instantly retrieved for you to make any corrections. The Undo option will remain available for specified number of seconds chosen in step 4.


