She clinched 3 gold medals - 50m, 100m and 200m Bi-fin and won the Individual Championship as well.








Two students won the First position in 10th All-India Inter School Music Competition, organised by Routes2Roots and VIRSA:

Out of thousands of entries, only 21 were chosen as the winning entries across India.





Laira Arora of Class II, won the Championship trophy in the 6th State level Abacus Competition, conducted by Skill Smarter, on 17th October 2021.


Ayansh Kapoor of Class I, won a gold medal in Abacus competition, Level organized by Study Abacus (India) in December 2021.




DIGITAL AMNESIA

















PEER LEARNING SESSIONS





CONCEPT BUILDING SESSIONS
















HAPPY MORNING MANTRA
