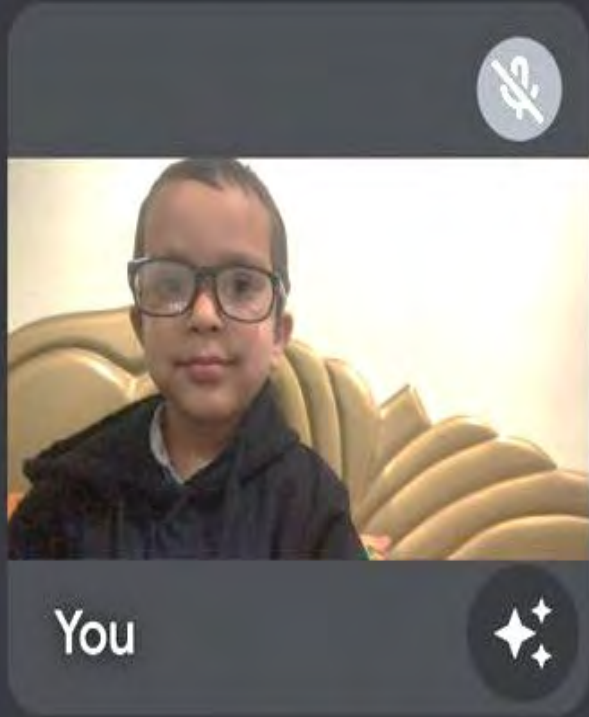

LIFE SKILL ACTIVITIES

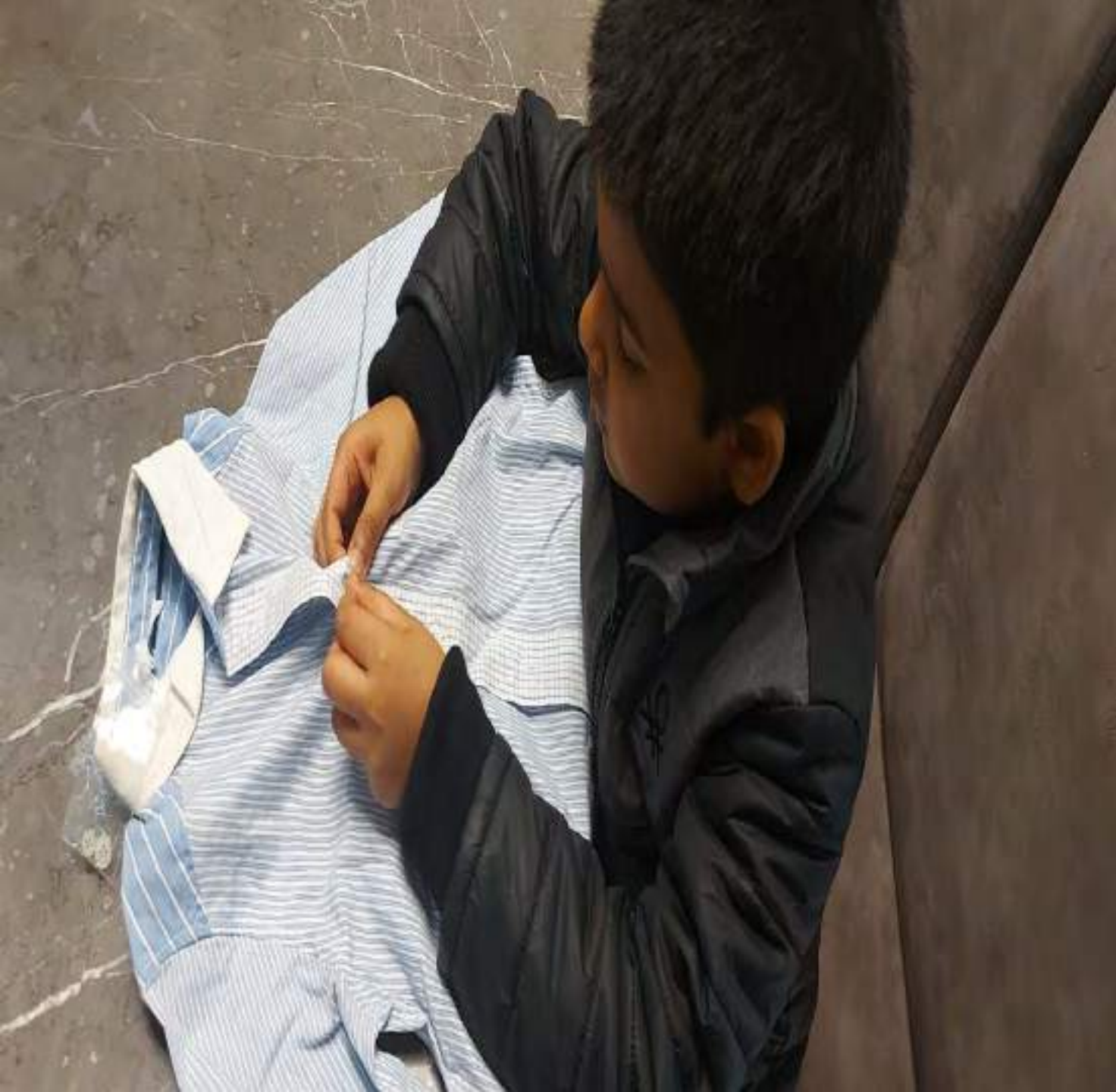
As part of ongoing **life-skill** programme, various activities were taken up in Class I, during the online classes in November and December, in which the students were trained in the following:

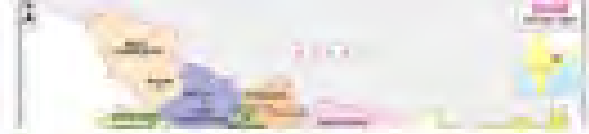
VIRTUAL CLASS PARTY

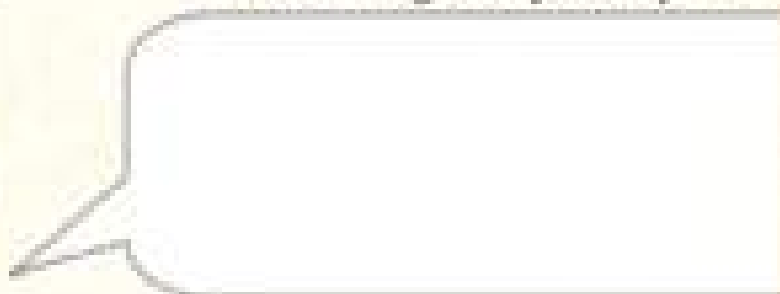

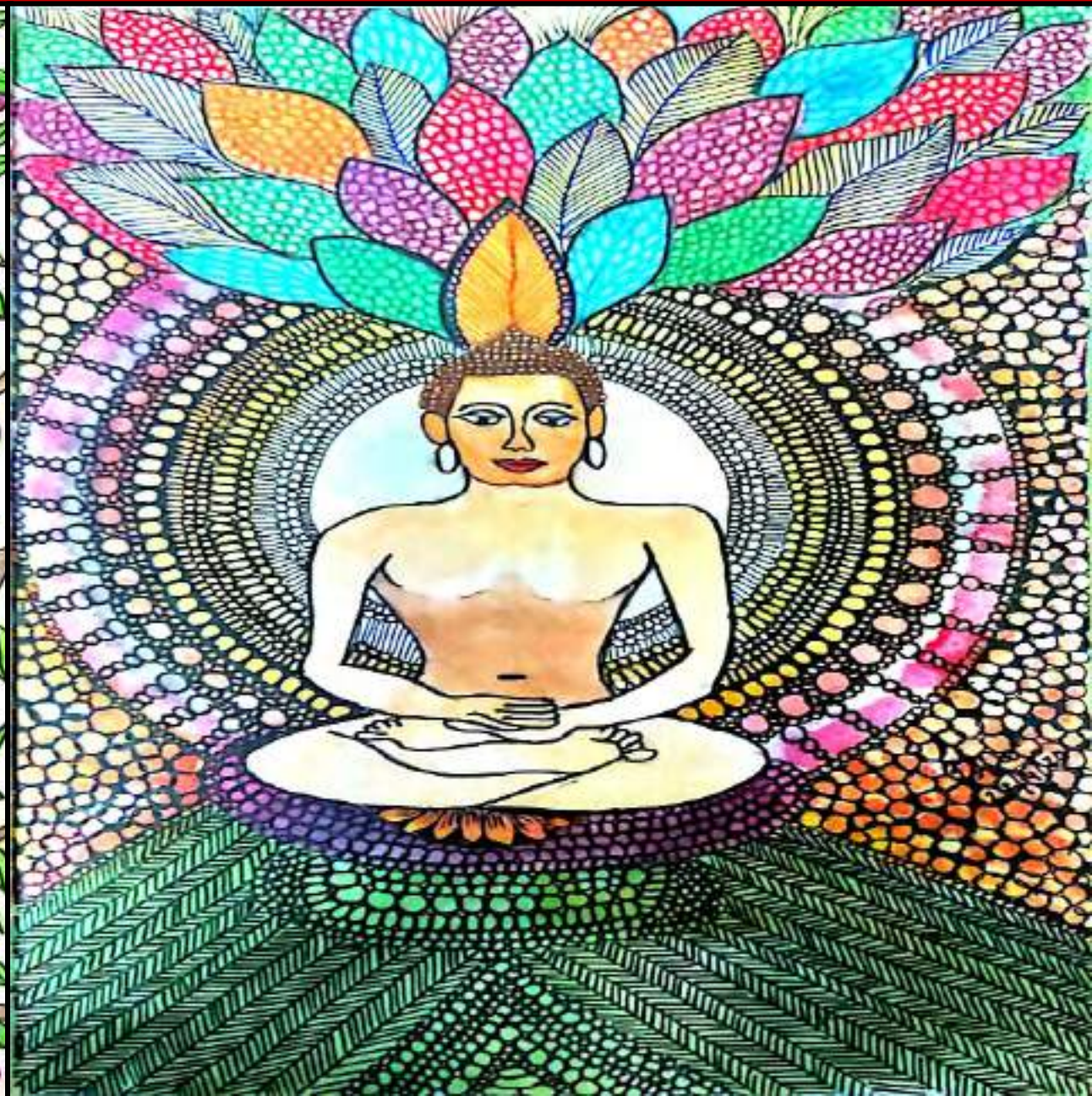

A REVOLUTION AGAINST PLASTIC USE

Priority is to avoid single use plastic WRITTEN BY REYANSH SAINI

Plastic has become part of our everyday life. They are flexible, convenient and used in many applications. However, the single-use nature of many of these plastics contribute to a wasteful, take-make-dispose economy.

On 15 June 2020 the State Government announced it was fast-tracking Western Australia's Plan for Plastics. This Plan for Plastics was informed in response to community feedback and provides a roadmap towards a more sustainable, plastic-free WA. The plan is consistent with the waste hierarchy by providing actions that:

- Prioritize avoiding single-use plastics
- Replace high-use items with reusable alternatives wherever possible
- Promote non-plastic single-use alternatives that can be recovered, recycled or composted, if it is not possible to use reusable items.
