MIDDLE AND SECONDARY DEPARTMENT PROJECTS (2022-23)

NEWS REEL

With an aim to give exposure to our students and help them become confident orators, 'News Reel' has been initiated in all departments. Each department has been assigned a specific day of week to present the News Reel created by them. These reels are played in all classes of the respective department. This has proved to be an effective means towards enhancing the general awareness and communication skills of the students by giving them an opportunity on rotation to exhibit their potential.

FINANCIAL LITERACY

A financial Literacy program with an aim to inculcate Financial Literacy skills among students, is being planned across all Bal Bharati Schools for Classes I-XII. The modules of which are being created to teach the students how to manage finances.

To make the students future ready, a series of interdisciplinary group and individual activities pertaining to FINANCIAL LITERACY were conducted:

students as it gives a very positive start to the weekend.

Road Safety Day was celebrated in Preschool to Class X, on 13th May, 2022. Road Safety Rules
were reinforced through videos, stories and posters that were shared in classes. Children also
wrote slogans and poems on Road Safety. Children of PS and PP enjoyed singing and enacting
the rhymes on Road Safety.

RAMA KRISHNA MISSION

This global dialogue is an opportunity for young people to come together and dialogue about the UN's Sustainable Development Goals in a fun and engaging way. 20 students of Class IX have been actively attending these enriching sessions and honing their dialogue skills.

DIGITAL LIBRARY

Students across all classes were given an access to a Digital Library to read any book on their tab, PC or smartphone. The parents and students are quite appreciative of this initiative.

Keeping pace with the evolving times, the Senior Secondary Department has the 'My Classroom Digital Bookshelf' via Google Classroom. The Digital Bookshelf is a repository of different books, reference materials, assignments, sample papers, links of relevant websites, YouTube videos, Podcasts and other related academic resource material.

BUILDING AS A LEARNING AID

Visual stimulus accentuates the learning process and is often imprinted on our minds. The concept of Building As a Learning Aid (BALA) has been initiated in our school. As a part of this, different spaces like corridors and staircases across the school have been modified innovatively to convert them into learning spaces. Mathematical Formulae, Tables, Significant geographical and historical facts, have been painted on staircases and positive quotes now adorn various walls in the corridors.

NCC CAMP

22 boys and 17 girls of Classes IX and X attended an eight-day training camp at the NCC Bhavan, New Delhi in the month of September. These cadets were given military training in small arms and drill and were required to follow a disciplined routine.
