Class 4 - Slogan Writing

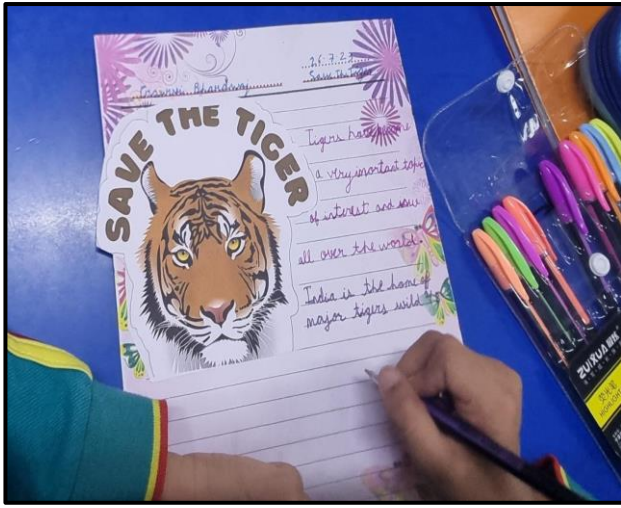
Class 5 - Essay Writing Activity

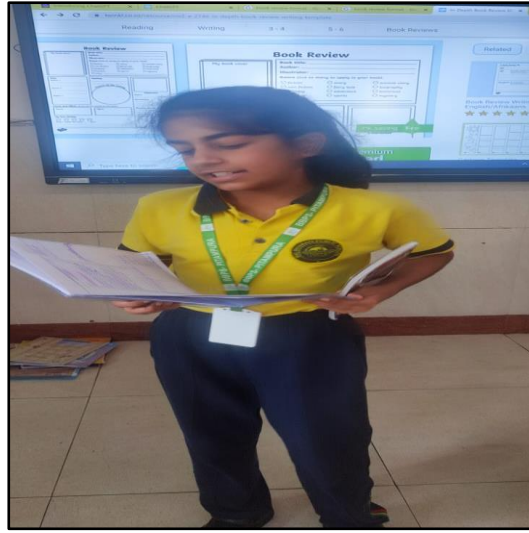
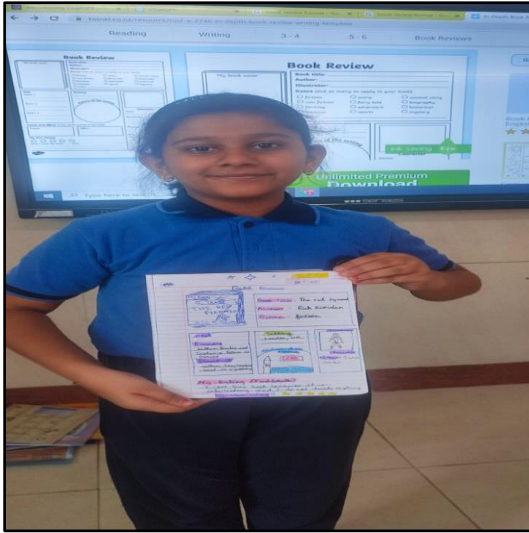
PINNACLE CLUB
