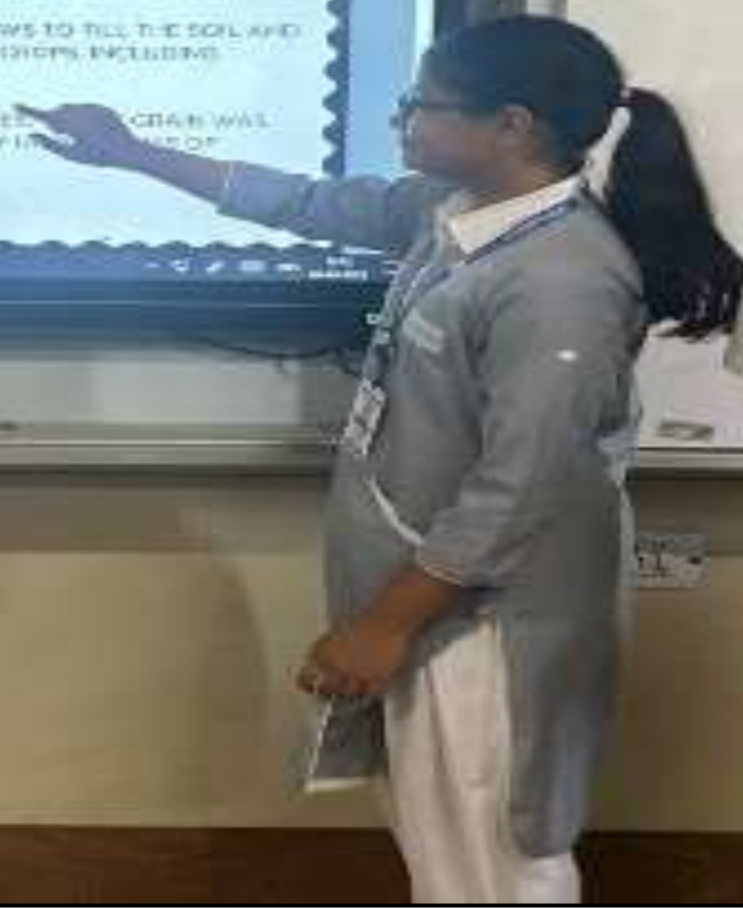
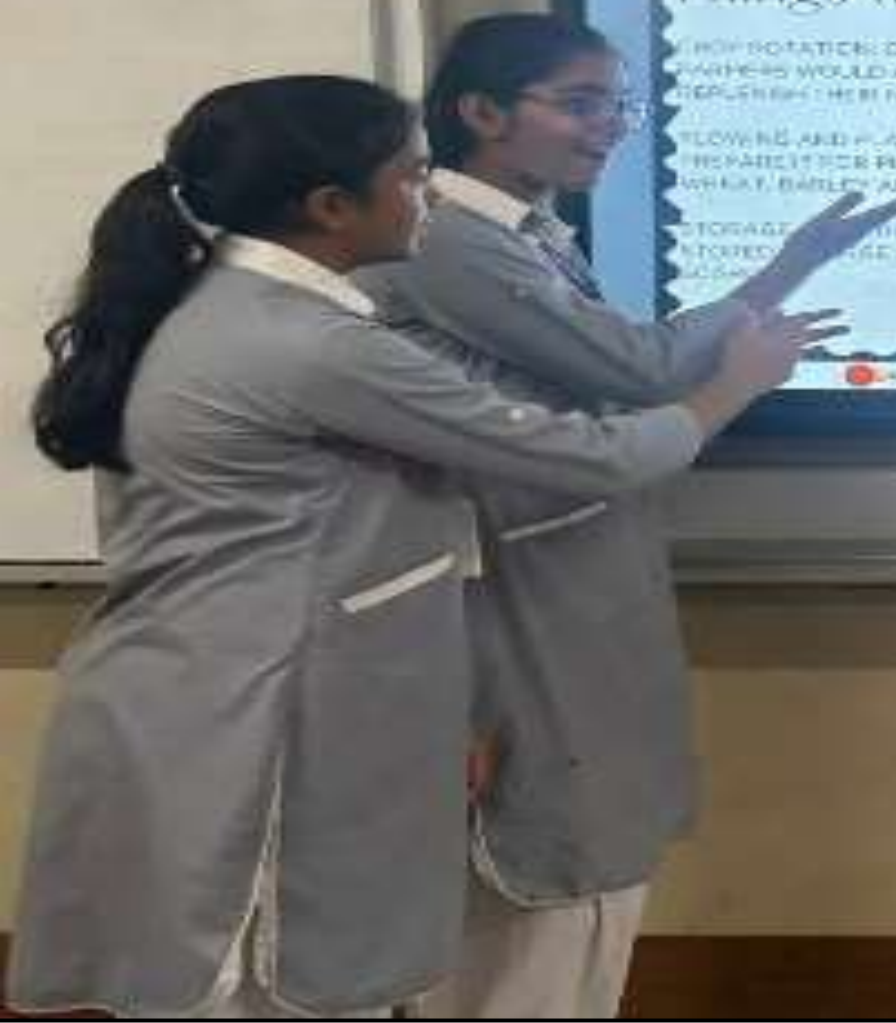


## Things we have borrowed from Egypt

- The Flag Code Of India, 2002, has been divided into three parts. Part 1 of the code contains **general description of the National Flag**.
- Part 2 of the code is devoted to the **display of the National Flag by members of public, private organizations, educational institutions, etc.**
- Part 3 of the code relates to **display of the National flag by Central and State governments and their agencies.**
- Flag Code Of India, 2002, takes effect from **January 26, 2002** and supersedes the 'Flag Code-India' as it existed.
