❖ CACA LIFE SKILLS



* Class IV - English - Puppet Making:-

An activity was conducted in Class 4 based on Toy Pedagogy wherein children made different kinds of puppets such as stick puppet, sock puppet, finger puppet and so on. They used waste material and other things easily available at home. The puppets were of various animals of their choice. Then, they were used in the classroom to showcase how the animals talk. Children tried mimicking the sounds made by a number of animals through individual and group performances.

> Sikkim Alphabet

Ek Bharat Shreshth Bharat is a mission to bring all the states closer to each other by understanding the varied culture, language, customs and traditions, cuisine, costume and economic activities. Sikkim is paired with Delhi. As part of the EBSB activity series, the students of Class 5 practised writing the alphabet of Sikkim. They read out the words aloud which sounded similar to the Hindi Varnamala.

Language building video, made under the initiative of EBES was designed to foster language development and communication skills among the children of Class IV. She recalled and shared her horrifying firsthand experience of her survival in the historic bombings at Hiroshima and Nagasaki in August 1945.

Ms Toshika proved to be a very positive and an inspirational influence on the audience especially during the question-answer session as she literally engineered their thought process towards making peace not only with themselves but also in their families, communities, societies and eventually across the globe. She laid emphasis on Forgiveness as the key to creating Peace among nations.






❖ Peace Pals International 26th Annual Art Contest for 2023 -
