• CACA

• Students of Class III made different birds and animals of their choice using playdough.





• An AIL activity on Angles was held in class 5 wherein students made a fish using a paper plate and decorated it. They also marked angles they could find in the fish. They also identified different types of angles marked. Students enjoyed doing the activity a lot and learnt about different types of angles through this activity.





• Parts of a leaf

The students were taken to the school garden and they collected different types of leaves. They identified the different parts of a leaf (Leaf stalk, leaf blade, main vein, side veins and stomata). The concept of presence of chlorophyll in green leaves was also discussed. Students were also able to classify the leaves as trees, shrubs, herbs and creepers.

Children of Class III enjoyed an experiential learning activity using the shapes blocks in their Mathematics block.






Clock making



diagram was not just a step toward building a robot, but a leap into a world where imagination and technology come together.






• THREE HEAT ZONES OF THE EARTH







• Assemblies

Our school has collaborated with Open Door, a program that offers subject specific assessments
followed by immediate feedback. These assessments provide our young learners with an opportunity
to not only master their concepts but also develop skills such as critical thinking, problem-solving, and
comprehending texts.

In this series of tests, four cycles of assessments are conducted in the session, one for each quarter. We have successfully conducted two cycles of these tests.





• Financial Literacy

In Class IV, Module no.2 based on Evolution of money was shown followed by a related worksheet. In this the teacher discussed the first exchange system as Barter system and its features. Due to its shortcomings, a new system had evolved as gold and silver coins. Then metal coins followed by modern day paper currency came into existence. And then the latest technology cashless or card transactions were explained.

Recognition of currency is an essential aspect of financial literacy. It refers to the ability to identify and differentiate various types of currency, including banknotes and coins. Developing this skill is crucial for individuals to navigate the economic world effectively.

In Class III, children were shown a module to help them understand how to recognize currency. They would now be able to identify the security features and characteristics of genuine currency.

Overall, this module was a valuable learning experience for our students, helping them to calculate the money required and money obtained in balance in simple buying situations and understand the meaning of purchasing power.


HIGHLIGHTS OF THE MONTH






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• National Space Day
