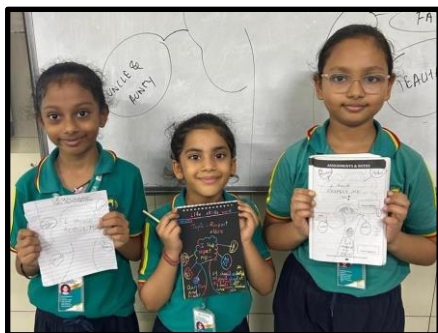

The workshop on respecting elders, conducted with the help of the organization Promise and led by resource person Bhavya, proved to be both engaging and educational for the children of Classes III and IV. The workshop was designed to cater to the children’s high energy and enthusiasm through interactive role plays and question-and-answer sessions, making the concept both accessible and relatable. The children enjoyed drawing the "Respect Tree," a creative activity that visually reinforced the importance of respect.

Recently, the students had an amazing time with the resource person, Ms. Bhavya, from Promise, who made learning about self-control both engaging and enjoyable. The learners actively participated by writing about things they need to control, such as screen time and anger, and reflected on why and how practicing self-control is crucial. The activity “Situation Cup” motivated them to tackle various scenarios, enhancing their public speaking skills and making the lesson both interactive and memorable.



A workshop on Saying Goodbye to being shy was conducted for Class III learners in the month of September 2024 in collaboration with Promise. 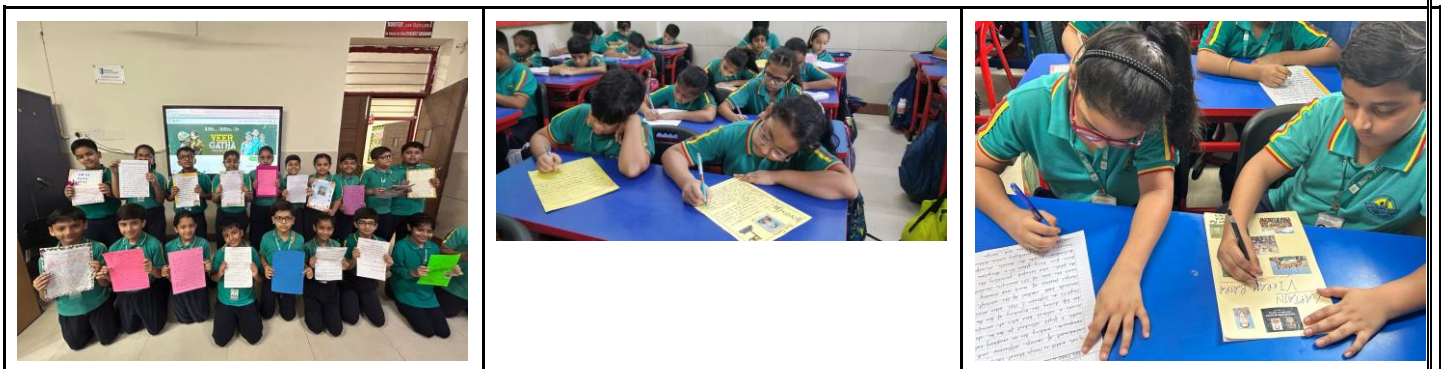

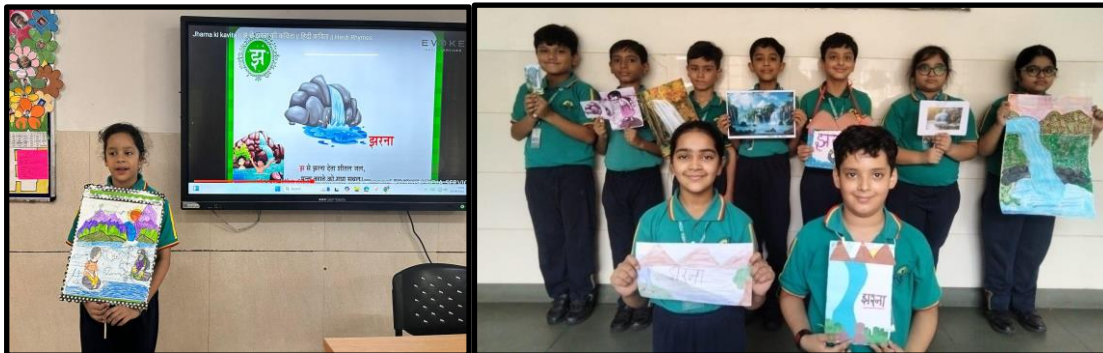
- As a part of No Bag Day, children of Class V were briefed about the use of dictionaries and techniques needed to refer to a word in any dictionary promptly. Vocabulary building exercises were also done.



- Oral dental hygiene: YouTube videos on dental hygiene were shared with the students of Class IV followed by discussion on Importance of brushing the teeth and why is oral hygiene important. To make the World Oral Health Day more meaningful and also as part of the chapter-Teeth and Microbes, a very interesting group discussion on causes and effects of Tooth Decay was held with the students of class IV. The children shared their everyday life observations and experiences of toothaches or tooth sensitivity. The students were explained how the invasion of germs feeding on the sweetmeats or other food particles stuck to our teeth lead to cavities in our mouth. Explicit, yet simple and easy to understand Videos links were shared in the class for comprehension by all. Live worksheets were taken up as exit tickets to ensure a good conceptual understanding by all students. Children also donned the role of dentists to advise on tips for care of our pearly whites. The discussion was interactive and enjoyed by all.

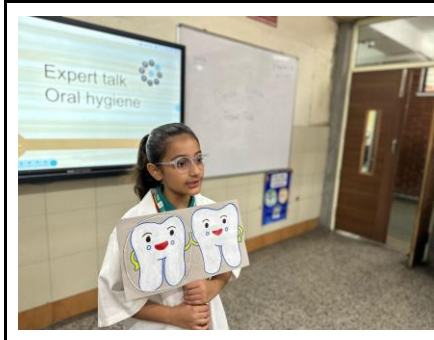

SPECIAL INITIATIVES:-

- ❖ **Expert Talks** wherein one/two students from each section dress up like an expert of any field and present their views on an assigned topic after research, promoting in-depth understanding and clear explanation skills. The topic can be of the student's choice. This happens once a week in the zero period and also on rotation so that every child gets a chance. The teacher assigns days to the students in advance so that they keep preparing.

As a part of this weekly initiative, Twisha Bansal and Sarvagya Garg from Class III F dressed up like little dentists and briefed their peers about the **Importance of Oral Hygiene** on 17th September 2024. They shared how important it is to take care of our teeth and how to brush properly, floss, and eat healthy food to keep our smiles bright and mouth clean. The whole class interacted with these 'experts' who were well prepared to answer their peers' doubts and queries.



- ❖ As part of the ongoing AI initiative, the students of the Primary Department got an understanding of Logic converter and an activity of logic converter with push button using tinker was conducted. 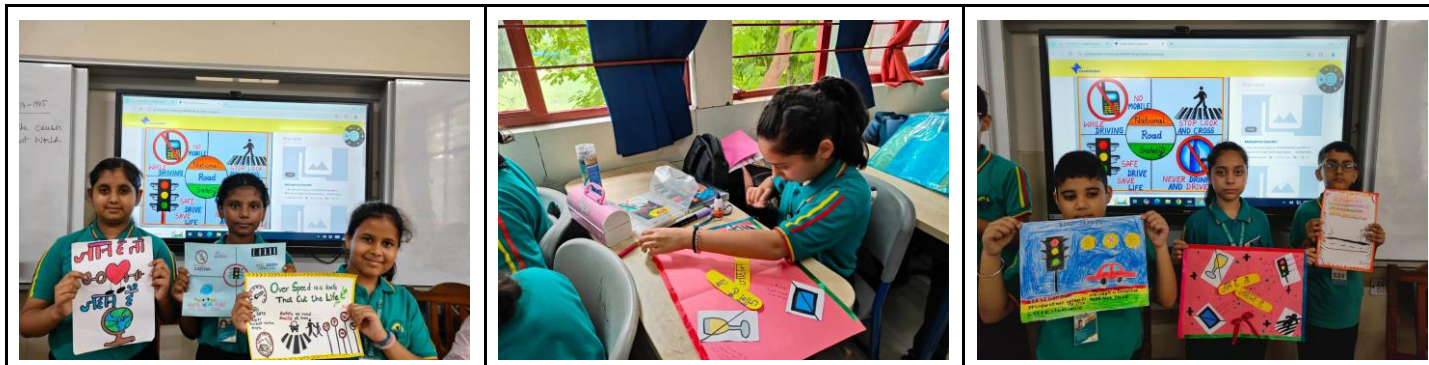
Art and Craft Club

A poster making activity was conducted by the Road safety club titled 'Jaan hai to jahan hai'. The students created beautiful posters and discussed the importance of following safety rules.



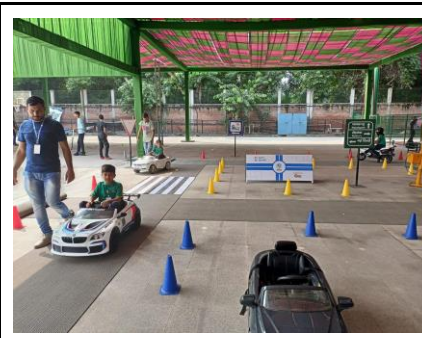
❖ The Heritage Club
