
Now that the summer holidays are here, it's time to enjoy some special moments together at home. But we also know how important it is to keep young minds engaged.

## **Sand Tray Tracing**

### **Materials Required:**

- 1. A shallow tray with sides on it
- 2. Semolina or sand

#### **Instructions:**

- Pour a thin layer of semolina or sand into the tray.
   (If you make it too thick, your child won't be able to see the lines they're creating).
- 2. Encourage your child to do scribbling, make horizontal and vertical lines using first two fingers. If they want, you can create a drawing for them to try to copy.



## # Note for the parent:

Make sure to keep an eye on your child during this activity so they don't try to eat the semolina or sand.

# **Writing Readiness Activity**

Skill: Eye Hand Coordination Fine Motor Skills

## **Pom-Poms and Clothespins**



### Materials required:

- 1. 12 small pom-poms
- 2. A bowl
- 3. Muffin tray/ egg tray with 12 holes
- 4. A clothespin

#### **Instructions:**

- 1. Put the pom-poms into the bowl. Set the muffin tray/ egg tray and the clothespin nearby.
- 2. Ask your child to use the clothespin to transfer the pom-poms to an empty hole in the tray. You might need to demonstrate at first to ensure they figure out the right way to hold the clothespin without getting pinched.
- 3. Have them continue moving pom-poms one at a time until they fill each hole. Then, ask them to put the pom pom back into the bowl.

### **Mystery Bag**

- Fill a bag with objects like blocks, spoon, toys, comb, cotton, etc.
- Encourage your ward to reach in without looking and guess what it is.
- Ask children questions like- What do you feel? Is it hard, soft or round?





# **Pattern Making**

Help your ward to use beads, coloured paper or toys to make and continue patterns.

Prompt children by asking What comes next?

Help your ward to keep their nails trimmed and clean.

Sneezing and coughing etiquette

Use role play to show sneezing and coughing into elbow or tissue.




Using the toilet

Encourage your child wiping properly, flushing, and washing hands after using exact washroom.

Use picture charts to support routines.







# **Holiday Assignment- 6**

### **Fine Motor Skills**

To develop Fine Motor Skills, engage your child in activities like:

- Squeezing bath sponges
- Turning pages of a book
- Watering plants using a spray bottle
- Playing with playdough
- Sorting different types of pulses
- Opening and closing bottle caps / tiffin lids
- Peeling boiled potatoes
- Building with blocks
- Zipping and Unzipping
- Buttoning and unbuttoning
- Stringing beads

- Tidying up toys/books after use






# **Social Skills**

- Help others in daily tasks.










**Straight Lines-Top to Bottom** 




# **Number Tracing-1**

- 2. Paste the objects within pre-drawn circles to form number 1.







#### **MY FAMILY TREE**

### Material required-

- A4 pastel sheet
- glue stick
- markers and crayons (green and brown)
- photos of family members (5-6)

#### Instructions-

- Let the child colour the tree.
- Paste pictures of family members on the tree.

### Talk about each family member

- As the child adds each family member to the tree, ask simple questions:
  - "What do you call him/her?"
  - "What do you like to do with him/her?
  - "Can you tell me something funny about Daddy?"

## **Call a Family Member - Pretend Play**

- Use toy phones or cardboard cutouts. Pretend to call Grandma or Dad.
  - "Hi Grandma! What are you doing today?"

# Picture Talk – "Our family moment"

- Enjoy some family time by looking through photos of celebrations, holidays, and special moments spent together.
- Show a photo and say Let's look at the picture together, who do you see here?
- "What is Grandpa doing in this picture? Can you remember?"
- "Do you remember what yummy food we had that day?"
- "What do you love about this person?"
